**If you have decided to use Dublin Airport here's how to get to Belfast:**

There are a few coach companies that provide buses from Dublin Airport (Or Dublin City Centre to Belfast).

1) Buseireann:

Leaves every 15 minutes from Dublin City Centre (Busaras Station), Journey time to Belfast 2 hours and 20 minutes and then Dublin Airport, Journey time to Belfast 2 hours .

2) Aircoach (12 € - 1h50 from the airport)

These leave both Dublin City Centre( O'Connell Street) and Dublin Airport to Belfast City Centre. They go every hour on the hour from the Airport. Journey time 1 hour 50 minutes from Dublin Airport to Belfast. Fare is 12 euro one way. For time table:

3) Translink Bus (9 € - 2 hours) :

These leave both Dublin City Centre(Busaras Station), and Dublin Airport to Belfast City Centre.

4) Dublin Coach (10 €)

These go every hour from Dublin City Centre (Custom House Quay) or Dublin Airport to Belfast.

5) Train:

From Dublin City Centre (Connolly Station) to Belfast. This is less convenient than the bus if you're flying into Dublin Airport as you'll have to get from the Airport into Connolly Station. One way is around 12 euro if bought in advance online.

*NB: All the buses arrive in either Europa Bus Station on Glengall street which is only 3 minutes walk to the Maldron Hotel. Most trains arrive in Belfast Laynon Place which is a 15 minute walk to the Maldron Hotel.*

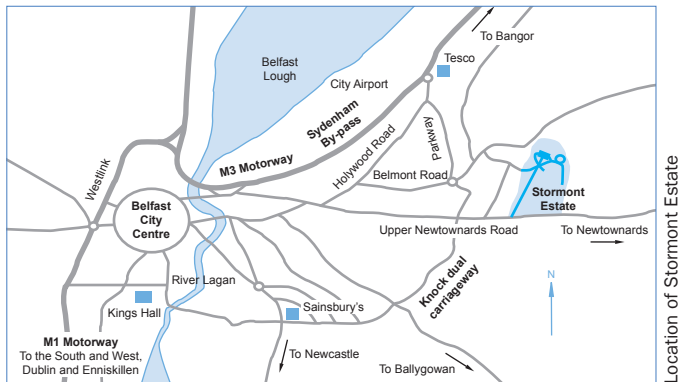


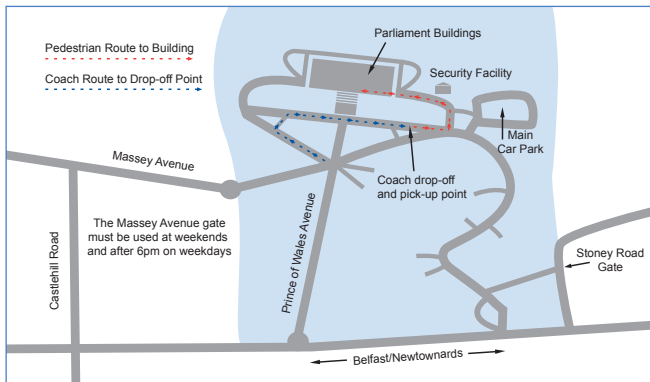
## Northern Ireland Assembly

Parliament Buildings in Stormont Estate is where the Northern Ireland Assembly meets to do its work.

There is a regular Metro bus service (20a and 23) to and from Stormont Estate.

You are welcome to visit the Great Hall in Parliament Buildings between 9.00am and 4.00pm, Monday to Friday. You can watch full meetings of the Assembly (plenary sessions) from the Public Gallery on Mondays from 12 noon and on Tuesdays from 10.30am.

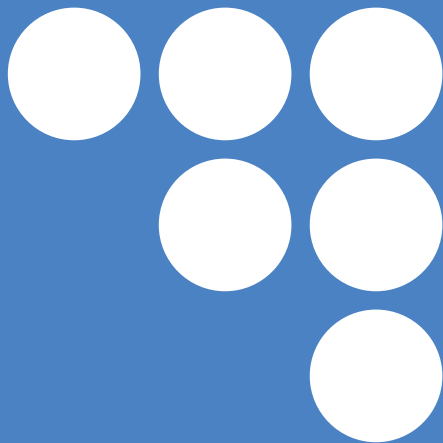




There is no charge for visiting Parliament Buildings. When you arrive you will be asked to go through a security check.
